We aim for children to develop their conversational skills to be able to speak with increasing confidence and fluency, continually improving their accuracy of pronunciation and intonation. Core Vocabulary skills (such as greetings, numbers, colours, days and months) are revisited regularly to enable pupils to regularly recall this knowledge. Knowledge organisers and vocabulary lists are used within each unit as these support pupils' language development and confidence.
